**WHO: Grace Haverty** – Grace is a nationally known award-winning artist whose chosen medium is both Pastel and Watercolor. She has won numerous awards for her pastels and watercolors on a national basis as well as selected juried shows. She has been featured in published articles in the leading art magazines as well as in North Light Books. Grace divides her time between Arizona and Minnesota.

**WHEN:** Saturday, January 9, 2010 – 9 A.M. to 4 P.M.

**WHERE:** Library of the Scottsdale Artists' School, 3720 N. Marshall Way, Scottsdale, AZ 85251. As we will be sketching in downtown Scottsdale, students will have a choice of either bringing a sack lunch to eat on site or lunch at one of the local restaurants.

**WHAT:** Participants will meet indoors in the Library for the first hour of the class. At that time, Grace will show students all of her supplies and explain how she goes about sketching outdoors. She will give a small demo and then have the students do a few drawings to get everyone warmed up. She will also bring in still life objects for students to practice on. The class will then move outdoors to work in their sketchbooks.

“This is a fun workshop: nothing too heavy; nothing too serious. Working in a sketchbook is not a finished painting. You will love it and the more you do this, the easier it gets. Let’s just have a good time,” encourages Grace.

***SUPPLY LIST FOR OUTDOOR SKETCHING***  
***With***  
***GRACE HAVERTY***

Holbein Drawing Book F3, 20 Sheets, No. 30C-1 9 x 10 ½ - 80 pound paper or whatever sketch book you like but it must be heavy enough to hold a small amount of watercolor.

Micron pens, Faber-Castell Pitt artist pens or any black pens various size tips. You might want to use a brown pen for variety. Whatever pen you may choose, it **MUST** be waterproof. **NO** felt tip or marking pens.

Watercolors: Bring whatever set you have on hand. You may wish to use a travel set as opposed to tube paints. The class will be using only a limited wash so not too many paints are needed.

Usual supplies you need for outdoor painting: paint brushes, bucket of water, paper towels, small garbage bag and whatever else you need to paint with on location.

A camp stool or you may stand. Most places you will be at, there will be some sort of seat.

Grace does not use a pencil but if you are not comfortable drawing directly with a pen, please bring a pencil; however, she would encourage students to start directly with a pen.
