2007 AAG Scholarship Winners' Exhibition at Paulina Miller Gallery

The Scholarship Committee is proud to announce the winners of this year's Arizona Artists Guild Scholarship Awards. Works were submitted by art students from a variety of Arizona's colleges and universities, proving to be a close competition of many original artistic voices. The panel of jurors had to make difficult decisions in order to narrow the field and choose worthy candidates.

Five scholarships have been awarded. The first is the Ruth S. Magadini Award of \$1,000 to painter Lisa Corine von Koch from ASU. Ruth's family has generously funded an on-going endowment for the purpose of continuing the Guild's scholarship program. The remaining \$3,000 has been divided between four outstanding and diverse artists: \$1,000 went to Lauren McAdams for her metalwork; Kjellgren Alkire, an installation and performance artist, also received \$1000; and two \$500 awards went to ceramic artist Adil Rahee and fibers and drawing major Nick DeFord. The artists were invited to speak at the February Guild meeting and showcased their art.

Additionally, scholarship recipients have been invited to exhibit their work during the month of March at the Paulina Miller Gallery at 817 N. First Street in Phoenix. An artists' reception and presentation of awards took place on Saturday, March 3 from 1:30 - 3 p.m. at Paulina Miller Gallery during Art Detour 19. The annual scholarship is one of AAG's most significant contributions to the community by endorsing future art careers.

Rowell Quinton Conducts March 20 Critique

Join Rowell Quinton at the upcoming AAG meeting on March 20 at 6 p.m. while he conducts the pre-meeting critique of in-progress pieces brought in by members.

Rowell is Canadian born and raised in Washington State. His ability to draw was evident at an early age. Rowell attended the Art Center School in California under a scholarship from General Motors. He majored in Industrial Design and graduated at the top of his class with a BPA degree.

As an industrial designer, Rowell was one of the designers who developed the original Ford Mustang and worked on the Boeing SST. While working in the automotive field, he began his fine arts career, which has now spanned over 40 years.

Rowell has won numerous awards and his work has been shown in numerous museums and galleries throughout the Northwest. He has taught illustration, life drawing, and fine arts at the university level. Additionally, he has juried art shows and receives many requests to conduct demonstrations and lectures.

Since moving to Arizona, Rowell has turned to Western Art. Most recently he was awarded Artist of the Year from the Scottsdale Art League. His first love has always been painting, and he continues to attend classes and workshops in his ongoing quest to perfect his craft.

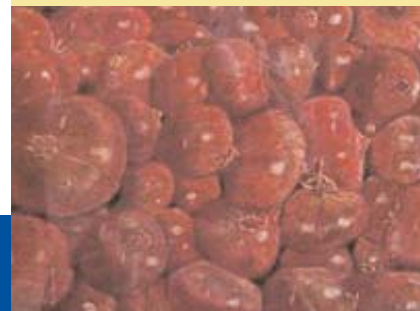

Full-time artist Bill Cupit works in a variety of mediums, including acrylics, oils, colored pencil, and banana bark collage. His "Bananascape" won several awards at the annual show of the Pacific Handcrafters Guild at the Ala Moana Center in Honolulu, where he lived and worked for 25 years.

His work has been featured at the international and state levels of the Colored Pencil Society of America. He helped start the Arizona chapter of CPSA and served as president for two years. He has also had a one-man show at the Chandler Regional Library, sponsored by the Chandler Center for the Arts. His colored pencil work has received numerous awards and he teaches basic drawing, acrylics, and colored pencil techniques at the Creative Arts Center at PebbleCreek. 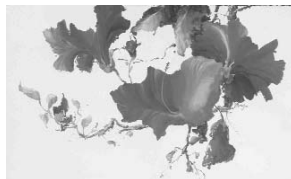
