This workshop is for artists who have some experience painting. You will learn various methods for abstracting or loosening up your images if you paint in a realistic way, and techniques for painting in a totally non-representational way if that is your goal. Acrylics lend themselves well to the use of textures, collage, glazing, etc., but you may bring whatever media you use. You will learn, among other things, how to use the elements and principles of design and color theory to problem solve, as well as different ways of applying paint.

Please bring: Paints you prefer to use, brushes, palette, water container, paper towel and anything else you might wish to use.

Something to paint on – Canvas, watercolor paper, board etc. Extras in case you need them.

A picture or two of an abstract or non-objective painting you like... it can be of any artist.

Photos you might normally use as subject matter if you work from photos. **Optional Materials:** Collage materials, fabric, string, pictures, etc. Appropriate adhesive such as any acrylic mediums. / Light molding paste, acrylic medium, etc. / brayer or sponge roller / large brush, such as a house painting brush, 2" or 3" or larger if you are working large / sponge / pastels / watercolor or oil crayons compatible with your medium / charcoal / sketch book, pencil
