AAG Presidents Message

As I write this, another AAG year is quickly coming to a close. I am stunned that it is here so quickly. The time went by in a blink. From my perspective, it has been a stellar year.



Distilling our mission down to its core, AAG promotes the visual arts through education, exhibition and outreach. Underneath all of that is community. We are a unique community of artists with common values. We come together with compassion, creativity, encouragement, and an openness to growing, expressing, and exchanging ideas. When I speak about AAG people are astounded to hear about what we do, who we are, and how we serve not only one another, but a broader community as well. There is no other arts organization quite like ours.

I am enthusiastic about the Perennial Picassos, the newest segment of our outreach program that will bloom Sept 20th. 

AAG's Veteran Art program gives our Veterans' a chance to work withdifferent types of artwork, techniques and artists. April's Veteran's Art program was a fun filled mixed media project that had many Veteran's producing very personal work. Lynda Burruss did a program on creating a very personal collage.

Linda showed some artwork she had created, Linda and Art Smith brought in some unique paper items for the Veteran's to work with and Mark

Woehrle brought in photos he had done of the Veteran's to use in there collage project.

The Veteran's thoroughly enjoyed the project. They worked intensely on each of their projects which were very unique and some were very personal statements.

This program is supported by AAG donations and funding from the Arizona Arts Alliance. It's designed to provide meaningful art instruction to Veterans of US Military Service for free. Since June 2014, this program has helped, on average, 15 Veterans each month, learn how to be an artist.

Proposed changes to AAG by-laws:

Article 5 – Executive Board and Directors Add 'Vice President's of Outreach Program'

Article 6 – Duties of the Executive Board – add the following:

Sec. 9 – Vice President/s of Outreach Programs

- a. May be a singularly held position or shared by two people. If shared by two, shall share or divide responsibilities, as they shall deem necessary, in ongoing communication and coordination with one another.
- b. Shall work toward fulfilling AAG's mission to maintain and create outreach programs and services.
- c. Provide arts education and creative experiences for identified groups through regular classes.

Shall be responsible for 1.) Oversight of all subcommittee chairs in the Outreach Program 2.) Oversee all educational programming in the community outreach program. 3.) Shall maintain all records of programs and work with the treasurer to ensure proper documentation and tracking of donations and spending 4.) Shall appoint such assistants and/or committee chairpersons for the performance of these responsibilities as he/she shall deem necessary 5.) Shall actively pursue the procurement of funds through donations, grants or other sources

Begun in 1993 the AAG Scholarship Program has given over \$100,000.00 to university enrolled, full-time fine art students in the State of Arizona. 
