A note from the President....



Since this is my first President's message I must take a few lines to thank Tess Mosko-Scherer and David Bradley for the years of hard work and the thousands of intelligent decisions that made AAG what it is today. Almost everything you see at AAG has been touched in some way by these two past Presidents. Also I must thank the board of directors for their

dedication, hard work and guidance. They keep AAG functioning like a well-oiled machine. And you the members, I want to thank you for your participation. This entire organization exists for you – it exists to help you succeed.

How does AAG help you succeed? First: AAG opens doors with exhibitions, workshops, demos and events. These events help you grow as an artists. Second: AAG gives you a chance to be part of a larger community of artists this is something money can't buy. Third: AAG provides a comfortable place to acquire and share art related knowledge. AAG is a valuable asset to local artists, the city of Phoenix, and the state of Arizona.

From there he carried his easel, canvas and paints up into the Catskill Mountains and painted the now famous Oxbow painting which hangs in the Metropolitan Museum of Art. For the first time many people living in dark overcrowded cities saw the wide open spaces just over the horizon. Soon other artists, carpenters, teachers, farmers, merchants were heading west to build the great nation we enjoy today. Never underestimate the contribution your art can make and the AAG workshops, critiques and demos provide a great opportunity for you to hone your artistic skills.

Be sure to attend the General Meeting on September 17, 2019. There will be a reception for last year's Artist of the Month winners and the Artist of the Year winner plus their art work will be on display. Also there will be an educational demo by Ann Osgood. She will be demonstrating how to paint flowers in acrylic. Ann Osgood has a workshop on October 18, 2019. Sign up and learn how to paint large flowers in Acrylic.

Plus the annual budget for 2019-2020 will also be presented and adopted. There will be a critique session so bring a piece of your artwork to have it critiqued. And you can enter a piece of your artwork in the Artist of the Month contest.

On another note, if you want to take full advantage of all the opportunities the digital world has to offer, attend Tess Mosko-Scherer's digital media labs. Digital Media Labs will be held monthly on the second Friday of each month.

AAG's Community Outreach Art Programs

Since its inception in 1928, Arizona Artists Guild has promoted the arts through education, exhibition and outreach.

Community outreach is the cornerstone of the Arizona Artists Guild's activities and is the main focus of our organization. We recognize the impact that art has on people's lives and it's potential for facilitating healing which is immeasurable. AAG recognizes the value of the arts in how it enriches lives. Guild members and Outreach Program participants alike relate stories about how their lives were changed through their own exposure to Fine Art, be it at an early age or later in life when they could pursue a life long urge that had been repressed due to family and career obligations.

AAG provides free monthly art classes to underserved segments of our community who find an improved quality of life through making art.

Veterans Art Classes: AAG provides free art instruction for Veterans of US military service. This class meets on the fourth Saturday of the month from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm. This project is supported in part by the Arizona Art Alliance which receives support from the Arizona Department of Veteran Services. Survivors of Suicide Art Class:

This program is designed specifically for friends and families who have lost a loved one to suicide as well as those who have attempted suicide and survived. This project is supported in partnership and funding from Your Art Your Story.

MARK WOEHRLE 1947 – 2019

Photo-artist Mark Woehrle left us on August 20, after a 6-month battle with ALS.

Mark was trained in photography by the US Air Force and as an apprentice to several professional mentors. In 1974 he started his own art photography business, F-Stop of St. Louis, which he operated until his retirement in 2009.

Mark was co-founder of Image Center for Photography, St. Louis, MO and was an Instructor at St. Louis Community College, teaching history of photography and photographic processing from 1982-1986.

Mark was a Juried Member of AAG. He served on the board of AAG for nearly 10 years, as Vice President for Meeting Logistics and as a Director. At AAG Mark wore many hats; he was our Historian, event photographer, and contributed many hours as Newsletter Editor. A veteran himself, he was an active supporter and helper for our Veterans Art Program since its inception.

In addition to making fine art photographs, Mark was an avid collector of late 1800s to early 1900s photographs by renowned American and European photographers. In June, he graciously donated this large teaching collection of rare landscape and travel photos to the University of Arizona's Center for Photography.

Funeral services for Mark will be held September 9 in Fairview Heights, IL. He will be interred at Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery, MO, with full military honors. A memorial service in Peoria, AZ will be scheduled for October.

Mark was a firm believer that excellence in art, and excellence in life, can not be photo-shopped at the end—it needed to be built in from the beginning.
