Each Module has six classes, and meets for 3 hours per class.

MODULE 1: Sculpting the Portrait | Saturdays - January 30, February 6, 13, 20, 27, & March 6, 2021

Create a clay sculpture using slabs of clay wrapped around a newspaper form. Participants will sculpt a life size bust of someone close to them, a favorite pet, or a historical figure.

MODULE 2: Pottery on the Wheel | Saturdays - March 13, 27, April 3, 10, 17, & 24, 2021

Make plates and bowls on the potter's wheel. Participants will also learn how to use and apply ceramic glazes for color and design.

MODULE 3: Raku | Saturdays - May 1, 8, 15, 22, 29, & June 5, 2021

Participants will learn the non-traditional type of ceramics called raku.
